Beach Life in the Slow Lane

Have you noticed the traffic recently? The tourists are out in full force and our seasonal friends have returned. Welcome back! It has been quite congested driving through Long Beach lately. I mostly use Sandridge and avoid it altogether but sometimes I need to go to downtown Long Beach. The deer are not the problem. It is the people darting out between parked cars to cross the street nowhere near a crosswalk. But both Pacific and Sandridge can be problems too. PSAC BUILDING EXPANSION UPDATE



The new septic system will be first. Woody's will be building it and a big Thank You to Templin Foundation for a \$30,000 donation to the project. Unfortunately, that will involve removing a lot of the nice plants/shrubs we have in that area. We are inviting members to come dig up a plant or two so they can have a nice new home. The areas will be marked off and you must check in at the office BEFORE you start to dig.

Building costs have skyrocketed nationwide and we are no exception here. EFA (Erik Fagerland Architects) have worked really hard to get the best deal they can on all parts of the build. By the way, EFA designed our original building! Your Building Committee has worked closely with EFA on all aspects of the planning and

budget to make it happen. You can be assured that we are making every penny count. SO - who are the PSAC members on the Building Committee? John Vale, our visionary; Karen D'Arcy (long history in obtaining grants); Earl Reynolds (retired architect); Bob Tripp (doing Community Outreach); Mark Mansell (has rich experience in building projects for school districts); Nick Michaud (building contractor experience); Billie Warrick (keeping us \$300,000 all organized); Fred Carter (keeping track of the budget!). This team has been working to make this

Our costs for the addition will be about \$1.3 million dollars. Yup-that is a lot of money.

Through wise investments and careful management of expenses over the years, PSAC will be funding about \$800K

happen for over two years and all deserve our thanks for adding this responsibility to their plates.

- Our membership has generously donated over \$150K
- Karen D'Arcy was able to get a grant from the State of Washington that will reimburse PSAC for 25% of our expenditures (will amount to \$264K). She also got the \$30K donation for us from Templin Foundation. She is continuing to apply for additional grants and donations
- The Peninsula Quilt Guild donated raffle guilts, and Sue Gallagher and Jennifer Guzell sold the coupon books. Oman & Son Builders Supply is donating the windows.
- EFA has done a lot of pro-bono work on this project, helping to keep costs down.
- Bob Tripp and Earl Reynolds will be approaching local businesses to ask for donations
- Multiple fun fundraisers are in the planning stages
- We even plan to get volunteers to help with some of the finishing! (e.g. painting, laying flooring, installing cabinetry, etc.)




