- Encourage social connections: Support seniors in maintaining contact with friends and family, and participating in community activities. You can also encourage virtual gatherings, phone calls, and social media. Invite them to our Thanksgiving and Christmas Potlucks!!
- Help with practical tasks: You can offer to help with household tasks, share a meal, or spend time with them.
- Encourage hobbies: Hobbies can help seniors feel less lonely and isolated, and improve their mental and physical health. Do you have a hobby that you could invite someone to share?
- When YOU Volunteer, invite a person that is alone to volunteer with you! This can help them feel a sense of purpose and alleviate loneliness.
- Exercise: Exercise can help combat loneliness and prevent depression. If you attend any of PSAC's exercise classes, invite a neighbor to join you
- Taking the time for a simple visit could mean the world to someone that is alone.

The Columbus Day Storm

This story tells the readers about the storm of 1962, and what I remember about it. If you lived in the Portland area during that time, and if you were old enough, you will remember this, too! I was old enough, so here's what I remember about it.

First of all, this was an historic event. The usual tranquil weather in the northwest had a blow-out on that day!.... I was in college, my freshman year at the University of Portland, in North Portland. The school was a long way from our home in southeast Portland, but my dad was the vice-principal at Roosevelt High School in North Portland, and since I didn't have a car, he gave me a ride to school everyday. It was my responsibility to get home on my own, always on the bus, as dad and I had different schedules.

When it began to blow, I was in the library studying. I heard the wind hitting the two-story windows on the west side of the large room. The glass was shaking, and the lights were flickering...Somehow, I felt like maybe this was serious, so I left campus, walked to the bus stop, several blocks to the north of campus, and caught a ride to downtown Portland...The wind was howling and increasing...I caught another bus headed to Southeast Portland, and there was talk throughout the bus about the coming storm...When I got to my stop, I still had a two-block walk home, and the wind was increasing!

I was the first one of us to arrive home, but the others arrived soon. Dad closed up the house, closed the south-facing windows with the drapes, and tacked them down along the edges of the drapes. He was always a person who got stuff done, and prepared the house for this storm. Candles and matches were located, as well as a few flashlights, windows were checked, furniture was moved around, out from the edges next to the windows. Our electricity was gone, and we really didn't know what else to do...I do recall that we were worried, but we did feel safe in our little old house. Dad set up a card table in the living room, far from the windows, and he found the pinochle cards and paper for scoring. He was always an organized person who planned and thought of all the possibilities. (I inherited that from him.) So we played cards for hours. I think we found "supper" ...leftovers foraged from the 'frig, with dad hollering at us to keep the door closed!.... Anyway, we made it through the storm of the century, safe and sound. (Nothing major happened to our home, despite it being an old house...That house is still there, and is now 116 years old.)

P.S. from Billie Warrick: MEANWHILE, I, at age 11, experienced the storm in the West Hills of Portland. My younger brother and I had ridden our bikes down Scholls Ferry Road to the Swanks house as we frequently did. On the way home, branches had started to break off of trees and we definitely put a move on it to get there. Keep in mind that in those days we did not have the kind of weather reporting that we have now and none of us were aware of what was coming at us. We got home to a very frantic mother, but thought everything would be OK. My dad was hunting so it was just mom, my older sister, may brother and I. We got a phone call from our next-door neighbor, Florence, from a hospital in Portland. A tree had fallen on her car and she had a broken arm. She hadn't planned on being gone very long and her garage door was open. My mom and I braced against the wind and walked down to her house. My mom took ahold of the double garage door and pulled it down until I reached it. As I took hold of it a gust literally lifted me off my feet!! We hurried back home and got inside just as a large tree in our front yard came down. My mom got us all into the basement. By then the electricity was out and all we could hear was the howling wind and some loud crashing. Telling us to STAY PUT, my mom ventured upstairs and found that the roof of our patio had blown off and another tree in the backyard had come down. Early the next morning we did get a call from my dad. He was complaining that his tent had blown over during the night, completely oblivious of what Portland had just gone through!!




