

Ghosts at the Battlefield

Before we moved to the beach, John and I lived in Montana. We had a cute little house in Hardin, just 15 miles or so from the Crow Indian Reservation and Custer Battlefield.

You have all heard about George Armstrong Custer, I'm sure. He has made his way into all the history books. And you have all heard about how he met his fate, at the top of the hill they now call Last Stand Hill. It is now an historic site, and thousands of people visit it each year.

Since we lived close by, I had a chance to see Last Stand Hill up close and personal! Friends of mine lived near the base of the hill, and asked me if I would like to come over for a ride, right near the boundary of National Park land, but on their property. Of Couse I said yes! The guys saddled the horses, and off we went to the south. It was an eerie ride, just at dusk, and I was uneasy, being in such an historic place, and having heard the stories about the ghosts who have been there, now for more than 100 years.

The ride was one of the spookiest experiences of my life. I felt the ghosts of the soldiers all around us, as well as the ghosts of the Indian warriors who just wanted to protect their homes and families. In our rush to hear the story, we have not heard about the families who just wanted a peaceful life. Having Indian guides that evening, riding their horses, in the valley below Last Stand Hill, made the experience of the battle broader than the history books portray. We often do not see all sides of anything. When I was a kid, and heard about Custer's Last Stand, I never really thought about the people who would be protecting their homes and families that day long ago.

Since the ride that evening, I have found out there are warrior ghosts on Lost Stand Hill who have appeared frequently, but only briefly. Indian decedents of these warriors have reported these sightings.

When our ride was over, our hosts unsaddled the horses, and we were all back to reality..... Ghosts continue to be seen and heard at the Battlefield today. It is usually at Last Stand Hill, and they only stay briefly. Most of the time they are here to remind us they are still around, ready to tell the story and hope that someone is listening.


